

Acacia amblygona

Small, spreading shrub, ranging from completely prostrate in habit to about 1.5m high. The bright yellow flowers to 10mm occur in globular-shaped clusters in the phyllode axils during winter and spring. The flowers are followed by seed pods about 50-70mm long which are curved or twisted in shape. The prostrate form of *A. amblygona* is a reasonably hardy ground cover which can spread to about 1-1.5 metres in diameter and is very spectacular when in flower. It prefers well drained soils in a sunny position. The upright forms are rarely seen in cultivation.
