

Acacia decora (Showy Wattle)

Erect or spreading shrub. It is sometimes seen in wetter areas in dry sclerophyll forest. The flowers are borne in large upright clusters both at the ends of the branches (terminal) and in the phyllode axils [late winter/early spring], making this one of the most showy of all wattles. Very widespread and important understory component of many woodland communities.



Type: Shrub to 1-3m
