

Acacia macradenia (Zig-zag Wattle)

A spreading shrub or small tree 3-5 metres x 3-4 metres with pendulous zig zagging angular branches. The branches of this plant are hairless and smooth. Generally, the younger part of the stem is green and the older parts are brown. New growth is often reddish. The large, bright yellow ball flowers occur in winter and spring and are followed by clusters of dark brown, smooth pods, raised over the seeds alternately and narrowed between the seeds. The pods are small, curved and have a smooth exterior casing.
