

Alpinia caerulea (Native Ginger)

Erect stems to 1.5m rise from a creeping rhizome and bear large, light green leaves in single plane on opposite sides of the stem. Bears white flowers throughout the year, followed by blue globular fruits about 1cm diameter. Attractive feature at pool side. The roots and white aril in the fruit are edible.
