

# Anigozanthus flavidus (Tall Kangaroo Paw)

A hardy, perennial herb, with evergreen leaves growing up to one metre long and two centimetres wide, forming clumps up to two metres across. It forms a rhizome, or modified stem underground, which grows to five centimetres in diameter. This rhizome makes the plant resistant to fire and drought, as it is able to re-sprout once conditions improve. All kangaroo paws are native to Western Australia. Flowering occurs from November to February – commonly yellow or green.
