

Archirhodomirtus beckleri (Rose Myrtle)

Shrub or small tree often at higher altitudes. Leaves opposite, glabrous, to 8cm, paler below, pleasantly fragrant when crushed. Pink and white flowers to 15mm in spring. Orange to red edible fruit to 6mm. Small size and handsome foliage make it suitable for small gardens
