

# Archontophoenix alexandrae (Alexander Palm)

Grey trunk (up to 30 cm thick) is ringed with noticeable leaf scars and is usually expanded at the base. Its massive leaves (3.5-4.5 m long) are clustered at the top of the trunk and have 60-80 narrow leaflets on each side. Leaflets have dark green upper surfaces and whitish-green or silvery-grey undersides. It has large flower clusters that are mostly white or cream in colour. Rounded fruit (8-14 mm long) turn from green to bright red as they mature.



**Type:** Palm to 15+m
