

Babingtonia similis (Twiggy Myrtle)

Shrub in open eucalypt forests, often near creeks and gullies. Leaves alternate, narrow, to 15mm long, aromatic when crushed. 5-petalled white flowers to 7mm, in groups of three, in summer and early autumn. Capsules to 3mm. Attractive foliage, hardy. Makes a good screen or hedge. Grows in coastal areas.
