

Baumea articulata (Jointed Twigrush)

Erect, tufted, perennial herb with stout rhizome, of freshwater swamps. Stems to 2.5m tall. Flowers early to late summer, drooping inflorescence red to brown. Moist soil to mud, grows in water to 1m deep. Tolerates light frost. Very hardy. It forms large dense swards of foliage that provide habitat for frogs and other animals and nesting material for water birds. Baumea has excellent nutrient soaking properties and is a favourite of designers in constructed wetlands.
