

Brachychiton diversifolius (Northern Kurrajong)

A fast-growing, deciduous to semi-deciduous, small tree. Leafless from late July to October. Fine oak grain in the inner blaze, light and soft timber. Perianth about 6-8mm long. Flowering and fruiting times vary but mature fruits are usually available October-December. Grows in open forest communities across northern Australia, sometimes found in or on the margin of monsoon forest and gallery forest.
