

Capparis arborea (Caper Bush/Native Pomegranate)

Shrub of drier rainforests. Paired spines to 12mm at leaf base. Leaves alternate to 12cm long. Adult plants less spiky than juveniles. Spectacular, perfumed white flowers to 4cm diameter in January to March. Edible fruit is shaped like a guava and yellow when ripe with many seeds.
