

Capparis mitchellii (Wild/Native Orange)

Small tree of drier rainforests. Spiny when juvenile. Leaves alternate, grey-green to 9cm, usually much less. 30mm white/creamy-yellow flowers spring to summer. Edible green fruit to 5cm, sometimes with irregular bumps. Has a dense crown and black, deeply fissured bark. Young plants are straggly and very thorny, but older plants become more erect and have fewer thorns.

Aspect: Full Sun
Soil: Well-drained
Habitat: Dry Sclerophyll
