

Casuarina equisetifolia (Coastal Oak)

Graceful drooping habit, fine foliage "sings" in the breeze. Reddish brown flowers in March to May followed by bird attracting woody cones to 15mm. Male and female flowers on separate trees. Aborigines used bark for dysentery treatment. Hardy, salt tolerant. Good for windbreaks and dune stabilising. Common beach tree.
