

Casuarina glauca (Swamp Oak)

Rounded /conical shape, slightly pendulous branches and 'needle-type' foliage. Male and female flowers on separate trees in Jul to November. Seeds and flowers attract birds including black cockatoos. Hardy and good in saline swampy areas but tolerates drier sites. This tree produces root nitrogen-fixing nodules.
