

Cissus antarctica (Kangaroo Vine)

Woody climber which forms a dense screen. New growth is coppery-coloured and hairy. Flowers spring to autumn. Related to true grapes and often called native grapes the ripe fruit have a grape like taste but can irritate the palate. Yellowish flowers about 5-6 mm diam. Fruit dark blue when ripe, astringent when placed in the mouth. Fruits globose, about 9 mm diam.
