

Citrus australasica (Finger Lime)

Uncommon, thorny, understory shrub or tree. Slow growing. White to pink, 3 or 4-petaled flowers in late autumn to summer. Edible, acidic, cylindrical fruit to 10cm in May-June. Leaves alternate, bluntly toothed, to 4cm long, hairless, aromatic when crushed.
