

Citrus garrawayae (Mount White Lime)

Rare, thornless, understory shrub or tree from Cape York. White to pink, 3 or 4-petalled flowers in late autumn to summer. Fruits are elongated, yellowish-green with green pulp, April to November. Broader leaves than other finger limes and shorter and thicker fruit. They have larger vesicles than finger limes and thicker skin with large oil glands like the round lime.
