

Diospyros geminata (Queensland Ebony)

Tree in dry rainforests, often close to the sea. Separate male and female plants. 3mm white flowers in winter. Yellow or red fruit to 7mm. Hairless leathery to stiff leaves, slightly glossy. Not a well known tree, an important species in threatened vine thickets. If you see this tree it is usually a good indication that you are looking at a patch of remnant dry rainforest, because it is not commonly planted and is very slow growing. It is unlikely to compete well with weeds. Its presence is a sign of good diversity.
