

Diploglottis Australis (Native Tamarind)

Tall tree with buds and young stems densely rusty-hairy. Handsome, leathery, pinnate leaves to 70cm. Small, creamish-brown 4-petalled flowers, in large panicles, in spring. 2 or 3-lobed seed capsules to 15mm, yellow to brown, with 2 or 3 brown seeds enclosed in sour, edible orange aril. Attractive street tree or for the larger garden, the dense canopy providing plenty of shade. It is easily identified by the large sausage shaped leaflets.
