

Diploglottis campbellii (Small-leaved Tamarind)

Endangered species. Attractive tree, dense crown with leaves up to 30cm long. Creamy 4-petalled flowers to 4mm, in panicles, spring to autumn. Yellow/brown edible but acid fruit to 5cm diameter, usually 3-lobed, with edible red aril surrounding seeds, ripens in late summer. Good for fruit drinks. Makes a good shady garden or street tree.
