

Dodonaea triquetra (Forest Hop Bush)

Open branched habit, growing on stony clay soils. Attractive glossy, slightly sticky foliage, tiny yellow-green papery flowers, winter to spring. Papery, 3-winged fruit to 15mm, can be green, pink or purple. Used by Aborigines to relieve toothache & fever. In colonial times, used as hops to make beer.
