


Dysoxylum fraserianum (Rosewood)

A typical long lived, slow growing and shade tolerant climax species. Requires ample moisture. Rosewood has been extensively logged for its fragrant red timber. Dense, spreading crown of handsome, dark green, glossy foliage and creamy white to pale mauve, fragrant flowers to 8mm in panicles, autumn to winter, followed by decorative, round, pinky-brown fruit at almost any time of the year.
