

Endiandria discolor (Rose Walnut)

Buttressed tree. Leaves alternate, to 11cm, with greyish waxy underside and several large hollow domatia. Tiny greenish, perfumed flowers in spring. 20mm ovoid black fruit in March to April. The habitat is tropical, warm temperate or subtropical rainforest, particularly on the poorer volcanic soil types, and alluvial soil near streams. The bark of older trees is rougher, with small depressions in the bark which are sometimes inhabited by insects. *Endiandra discolor* is a larval host for the fruit fly.
