

Endiandra pubens (Hairy Walnut)

Tree often found along watercourses. Branchlets, petiole and buds densely rusty-hairy. Leaves alternate, to 14cm long, glossy and glabrous above, dull and softly rusty-hairy below. Tiny perfumed whitish flowers in axillary panicles, autumn to winter. Red spherical fruit to 6cm, with one large seed to 4cm, October to February. The base of the tree may be flanged or somewhat buttressed in larger trees. The bark is pale, light grey or fawn in colour.
