

Eremophila debilis (Winter Apple)

A desirable ground cover plant worthy of cultivation for its flowers, fruits and foliage. Bulk planting has an attractive effect. The small flowers are set individually in leaf axils towards the end of the branches. Each five-petaled flower is about 1 cm in diameter, white with faint pink or purple tips or a totally 'bluish-white'. Flowering occurs in spring to summer with red to purple succulent mature fruit developing in February to March. Inland and arid plant.

Soil: Well-drained
Habitat: Dry Sclerophyll
