

Eucalyptus pachyphylla (Thick-leaved/Red-Bud Mallee)

Small tree with multi-trunks. The bark is rough and persistent near the base of the trunks but is smooth elsewhere. Leaves are broadly oval shape, tapering to a point - they are about 150 mm long by 50 mm wide. Flowers are cream to bright yellow and about 30 mm diameter, in clusters of three. Flowering occurs in autumn and winter and is followed by attractive, brown gumnuts with a ribbed surface.
