

Eucalyptus tereticornis (Qld Blue Gum/Forest Red Gum)

Tree to 40m on a variety of soils, but often shorter. Leaves alternate, greyish-green, curved, to 19cm x 3.5cm. Smooth white/grey bark peeling in irregular patches. Capsules with exert teeth. Big tree common on alluvial flats but also common at high altitudes on balsatic clay soils. Creamy white flowers in autumn to spring. Woody fruits to 8mm x 8mm. Hollow branches provide nest sites for wild life. Prime koala food.
