

Ficus obliqua (Small-leaved Fig)

Pale, grey buttressed, large strangling tree with milky sap. Grows on other plants or rocks. Leaves alternate, glossy, to 8cm, dark and glossy above, paler below. Petiole 10 to 15mm long, flattened. Paired axillary fruits, yellow, turning orange with dark spots, on stalks to 4mm, ripe in April to June.



Type: Tree to 15+m
Aspect: Full Sun/Part Shade
Soil: Well-drained, Fertile
Habitat: Wet/Dry Sclerophyll
