

Gossia bidwillii (Python Tree)

Tree with distinctive smooth mottled bark, usually green and brown (python like). Leaves opposite, glabrous, to 9cm long, paler below. Leaves aromatic when crushed and particles adhere to fingers. 4-petalled white flowers to 8mm, spring to summer. Edible black, globose fruit to 6mm. Can be difficult to establish and it is slow growing. Usually only a shrub or small tree in cultivation, though some specimens to 25m are known from the wild. Requires good drainage and responds well when soil is fertile.
