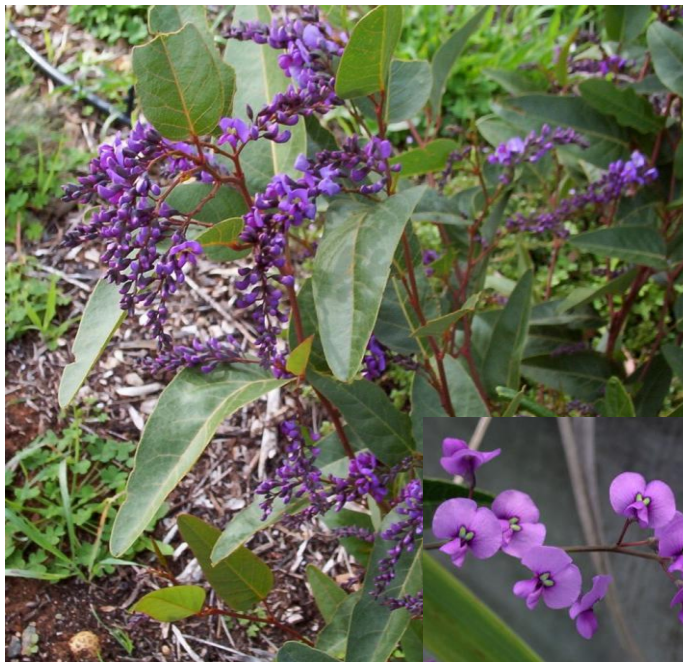


Hardenbergia violacea (Native Sarsaparilla)

Prostrate or twining vine, common in the area. Leaves alternate, leathery, prominently veined, to 10cm x 5cm. Purple flowers in racemes, spring. Pods oblong, flattened, to 4.5cm x 5 m. It is moderately vigorous but rarely covers other plants so extensively as to cause damage. Shrubby forms without any climbing tendency are known. The flowers are the typical "pea" shape consisting of 4 petals; the "standard", the "keel" and two "wings" appear in winter and spring.
