

Melaleuca bracteata (Black Tea-Tree)

Bushy shrub or tree with narrow, often twisted, leaves. Roughly furrowed, hard bark. White to cream bottlebrush flowers to 5cm long, after rain and in the spring. Small woody seed capsules to 3mm. Hardy and fast growing. Good for wet sites but will tolerate dry conditions. Suited to coastal areas.
