

Melaleuca thymifolia (Thyme Honey Myrtle)

Small shrub to 0.5m, in moist areas. Long-lived plant, drought-hardy. It has delicate reddish young stems and blue-green foliage, both spicily aromatic when bruised. Small clusters of stemless flowers, rich mauve to bluish-purple are produced below new foliage. Persistent woody seed capsules to 6mm. Thrives in any soil and needs little attention besides.
