

# Melaleuca violacea (Violet Paperbark)

Western Australia

Attractive dwarf shrub, usually flat-topped with purplish new growth. Branches are often horizontal and layering with small oval to heart shaped leaves which are pale green to greyish-green.. Bark is papery and sometimes corky. Profuse violet or purple flowers appear from September to December. Easily trimmed.
