

Melaleuca wilsonii (Violet Honey-myrtle)

SA native

This is most striking when it flowers in the spring. Growth is dense and branching is irregular, generally in straight, flattish sprays. The 1 cm long narrow, pointed leaves grow at a wide angle to the stem. They are smooth textured and have a lemon scent when bruised. In spring the young growing tips are bright green. Flower heads of feathery bunches of magenta-rose stamens may open at any time from October-November.



Type: Shrub to 1.5m
