

Notelaea johnsonii (Veinless Mock-Olive)

Uncommon shrub or small tree to 8m, of drier rainforests, often with crooked trunk. Lenticels obvious on branchlets. Stiff, leathery leaves opposite, to 12cm, pale below, net veins faint. Tiny, purplish-red, 4-petalled flowers in slender axillary racemes, autumn to winter. Oblong bluish-black fruit to 20mm, spring to summer.
