

Olea paniculata (Native Olive)

Grows in well developed rainforest but tends to be more common in drier, more seasonal rainforest. A fast pioneer species on sunny protected sites, but needs well drained soil for good growth. The trunk has smooth grey-brown bark. Whitish-green flowers from October to December. Bluish-black oblong fruit to 12mm, ripe May to December.
