

## Pittosporum angustifolium (Gumbi Gumbi/Native Apricot)

Weeping small tree or shrub. The small creamish yellow tubular flowers have a pleasant scent. Flowering occurs from late winter to mid spring. Up to 1.4 cm in diameter, the small round orange fruit resembles an apricot and can remain on the tree for several years. The wrinkled dark red seeds are held within a sticky yellow pulp.

**Aspect:** Full Sun  
**Soil:** Well-drained  
**Habitat:** Dry Sclerophyll/  
Mallee
