

# Psychotria loniceroides (Hairy Psychotria)

Understorey plant. Leaves opposite on the stem, egg shaped, 6-10cm long, softly hairy. Clusters of white flowers form on a loose branching head from December to March. The creamy/yellow berries in March to August are edible but not very tasty and can irritate the throat. Fruit matures from February to September, being a yellow or creamy drupe, 6 mm in diameter. Inside is a single oval shaped and ribbed seed.



**Type:** Shrub to 4m  
**Aspect:** Full Sun/Shade  
**Soil:** Well-drained  
**Habitat:** Dry Sclerophyll
