

## Stenocarpus davallioides (Fern Leaved Stenocarpus)

A small tree to about 10 metres high, rare. It has fern-like leaves which are divided into small leaflets, especially in their juvenile form. The adult leaves are less divided and have an overall length of 250-300 mm. The cream flower clusters occur in the leaf axils and are seen in late spring to early summer. Makes an excellent specimen for a larger container where its attractive foliage can be appreciated at close quarters.
