

Stenocarpus sinatus (Firewheel Tree)

Glossy dark green leathery foliage. Flowers bright orange-red in wheel-like clusters 7-10cm across near ends of branches, in leaf axils or arising from scars of fallen leaves. Appear February to March. Large dark brown seedpods containing winged seeds in autumn, attract birds. Hardy, suited to parkland, streets and large gardens. Used for cabinet timber. Spectacular when in flower.
