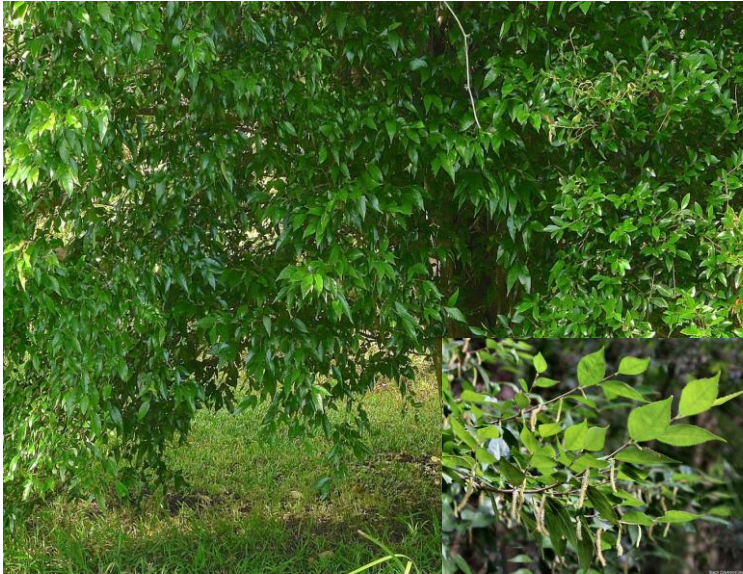


Streblus brunonianus (Whalebone Tree)

Often along watercourses. Twigs and petioles often with some milky sap. Tough bark. Leaves alternate, serrate, to 10cm and roughly textured. Minute separate male and female flowers, on spikes to 30mm, spring to autumn. Edible, globose yellow fruit to 6mm matures January to May. Small tree in the fig family.



Type: Tree to 10m
Aspect: Part Shade
Soil: Well-drained
Habitat: Dry Sclerophyll/
Riverine
