

Synoum glandulosum (Scentless Rosewood)

Tree often in understorey of wet eucalypt forests with scaly/corky bark. Lightly perfumed white or pale pink 4-petalled flowers in axillary panicles, summer to winter. 2 or 3-lobed red fruit to 20mm, splitting to reveal brown seeds in red or orange aril. Attractive foliage.
