

Syzygium australe (Creek Satinash, Brush Cherry)

Tree often along watercourses. Crushed leaves fruity. New twigs square with temporary outgrowths. Leaves opposite, shiny, to 8cm, paler below. White, fluffy, 4-petalled flowers to 20mm, summer to winter. Edible red, pink or mauve oblong fruit to 25mm. Excellent for beachside sites, as branches to the ground provide good protection from salt winds. Fruits very tasty.
